

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## Shikimi River Flood Hazard Map

This hazard map shows the presumed "Level of Flooding" and the location of "Safety Evacuation Shelters" in the event that Shikimi River floods from the expected maximum amount of rainfall. Nagasaki City's terrain makes it is easy for buildings to suffer damage during heavy local downpours. It is important to know beforehand which areas are risk areas and how to safely evacuate from them.







\*Flood risk zones are based on a map of flood risk zones designated by the Nagasaki Prefectural Government on July 1, 2022 in accordance with the Flood Control Act. \*This hazard map shows the presumed level of flooding due to an overflow of the Shikimi River in the Shikimi River System. However, areas outside of these risk zones may experience flooding and/or the presumed level of flooding may differ in reality. \*The 1982 Nagasaki Heavy Flooding (flooded area) shown on the map is based on the Disaster History Map (flood areas caused by heavy rain and precipitation in July 1982) of the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism, and revised with reference to the Nagasaki Torrential Rain Disaster Map of October 1982.
