Origin of Fukahori

- Fukahori was a territory of Saga Nabeshima in the Edo period. After the battle of Sekigahara, the feudal lord inherited Ebisu from Nishinomiya shrine in Hyogo which spread to the Saga province and Fukahori.
- Because the Ebisu of Fukahori is made of sandstone which is easily weathered, it was painted in the beginning of the Meiji era.
- The one enshrined near the coast is called Hama Ebisu and the one enshrined at the tip of the wharf is called Hato Ebisu.
- The Hama Ebisu festival is held on August 20th, and the Hato Ebisu one is held on September, 13th.
- The Ebisu statues in residences are enshrined with prayers for the happiness of each household.
